

## Chamber Meeting Highlights

Last month's meeting was held at Southwestern Illinois College, Red Bud Campus. Thanks to the generosity of Karen Stallman we were able to utilize the auditorium for out meeting as well as view a film on Lincoln's years as a lawyer, in conjunction with his 200th birthday this year. She also provided us with a tour of the facility and explained some of the programs the college has to offer for adults returning to school. Stallman mentioned that the average age of students attending the school is 28 and that many adults return to school for a variety of reasons including changing jobs, moving up the corporate ladder, or searching for a new field or more qualifications after being laid off during this difficult economy. The cost to attend SWIC is much more affordable as a community college than that which would be paid at a four year university, so it is often a good fit for both returning adult students as well as students just beginning their academic career.

Other than the traditional degree programs and classes that correspond with those, the college also offers a broad variety of community education courses on many topics that may be of interest to people of all ages. A listing of these courses is available in a booklet that has just been released for the fall semester. Copies of this booklet and the schedule for all fall classes at the Red Bud location is now available at the Prairie du Rocher post office for those who are interested.

In other Chamber news, it was reported that the new Prairie du Rocher brochure is days away from being sent to press. Copies of this brochure listing all the Chamber members as well as activities and festivals offered in Prairie du Rocher will be available in many locations throughout the county and in neighboring communities.

The community website, <u>www.visitprairiedurocher.com</u> continues to undergo changes and improvements. Keep checking this website for all the current and up to date news of happenings in the community.

Work continues on securing a grant for the development and improvement of the Creole House in Prairie du Rocher. More news on this topic as it becomes available.
